I. Rights deriving from the citizenship of the union

- mostly regulated in secondary law
- 1) Freedom of movement and residence (art. 21(1) FEU Treaty)
 - non-economic mobility
- 2) Right to vote and to stand as a candidate at municipal elections (art. 22(1) FEU Treaty)
 - in the member state of residence
- 3) Right to vote and to stand as a candidate in elections to the European Parliament in the member state of residence (art. 22(2) FEU Treaty)
- *A)* Right to protection by the diplomatic and consular authorities of any member state (art. 23 FEU Treaty)
- 5) Right to petition (art. 24 sub-sect. 1, 227 FEU Treaty)
- 6) Right to apply to the Ombudsman (art. 24 sub-sect. 2, 228 FEU Treaty)
- 7) Right to communicate with the Union's institutions in any Treaty language (art. 24 sub-sect. 3 FEU Treaty)
- 8) Right of access to the documents of the institutions (art. 15(3) FEU Treaty)
 - implemented in particular by comprehensive information on the website of the Union

II. (Economic) fundamental freedoms

- economic mobility
- 1) Free movement of goods (art. 28 et seq. FEU Treaty)
- 2) Free movement of persons
 - a) Free movement of workers (art. 45 et seq. FEU Treaty)
 - b) Freedom of establishment (art. 49 et sec. FEU Treaty)
- 3) Freedom to provide services (art. 56 et seq. FEU Treaty)
- 4) Free movement of capital (art. 63(1), 64 et seq. FEU Treaty)
- 5) Free movement of payments (art. 63(2), 65 et seq. FEU Treaty)

III. Fundamental rights (human rights)

- at first developed by the European Court of Justice
- binding to the member states only when they are implementing Union law or encroaching on the economic fundamental freedoms
- 1) Fundamental rights guaranteed in the Charta of Fundamental Rights of the European Union (cf. art. 6(1) EU Treaty)
 - a) Fundamental rights closely connected to human dignity (art. 1 et seq.)
 - b) Freedoms (art. 6 et seq.)
 - c) Equality rights (art. 20 et seq.)

- d) Social rights (art. 27 et seq.)
- e) Citizens' rights (art. 39 et seq.)
- f) Justice (art. 47 et seq.)
- 2) Fundamental rights guaranteed directly in the Treaties
 - prohibition of discrimination on grounds of nationality (art. 18 FEU Treaty)
 equal treatyment of men and women (cf. art. 157 FEU Treaty)
- 3) Complementary fundamental rights as general principles of Union law (art. 6(3) EU Treaty)
- 4) In addition (in the near future): Fundamental rights guaranteed in the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms (European Convention) and its protocols
